- There are over a thousand Species of agave world wide.
- The leaves of the plant are very rich in fiber: which can be used to make nets, sandals, mats, brushes and much more.

- Agave desertii was a staple food item for the Cahuilla and other southern California Native Tribes
- The plant reproduces from seeds as well as off-shoots form the root system
